DETAILS OF CONSTRUCTION

The Case is to be constructed of native hard wood of appropriate design; the large Metal Pipes in the front to be decorated in plain dull gold bronze.

The Ground Sill is to be extra heavy and with the upright frame is to be rigidly constructed of well-seasoned material, every portion firmly put together.

The Swell Box is to be constructed of heavy material framed together. Shades to be vertical, to swing on metal pins, bushed with felt, and so constructed as to insure tight closing and noiseless operation.

The Bellows and Regulators are to be of ample size to supply sufficient wind for the greatest possible demand and to furnish wind at a uniform pressure, no matter what the demand. They are to be framed with panels screwed on, to be double-leathered, with the best alum-tanned sheepskin, to be provided with automatic safety valve and regulating valve.

Wind Chests. The Wind Chests are to be of the individual valve type so that each pipe will have its own individual supply of wind, preventing robbing or unsteadiness of speech. The use of compressed air through tubes and channels to operate each individual valve avoids complicated levers and kindred devices, thus insuring instantaneous operation and repetition.

Couplers. The Coupler action is to be operated pneumatically, eliminating entirely any variation in the weight of the touch whether or not the couplers are in use.

Pipes. No stopped or mitred basses shall be used in any normally open stop. The Wood Pipes shall be made of the best selected stock, glue-sized on the inside and coated with two coats of shellac varnish on the outside, all to be supplied with wooden feet, metal toes being used for the smaller pipes and gates for the The large Metal Pipes shall be made of the best quality and appropriate weight of annealed zinc. All other Metal Pipes to be made of a composition of tin and lead in the proper proportions to give the best results for the quality of tone required.

The scale of all pipes shall be in accordance with the best standards, and the voicing shall be of the highest order of excellence, with the proper volume throughout.

Stop Action. The Stop Action shall be of the stop tablet type, with the tablets placed over the swell manual and plainly marked with the name of the stop or coupler, stops to be indicated in black, couplers in red.

The Crescendo Pedal shall be so arranged as to bring on the stops in accordance with the strength of tone and cancel them in the reverse order. It, however, shall be made adjustable, so that any stop not desired on the Crescendo Pedal can be disconnected from it.

Combination Pistons. The Combination Pistons, whenever provided for, are to be adjustable at the Console, double acting, so that they can be adjusted to bring on or cancel any stops which are so set. They shall also be so arranged that the couplers can be set to act with the Combination Pistons if desired.

With a view to securing the greatest possible durability and utility none but the best and most improved materials and methods of construction shall be used in any part of the instrument, so that the complete instrument shall be of the highest order of excellence.
