KAUMAKAPILI

Sketch of a Prominent
Landmark.

Brief History of the Large Pipe Organ—The Double Towers and Chime of Bells.

The burning of the Kaumakapili Church is much to be regretted. With its two steeples, occupying an elevated position, it was a prominent landmark. The fine structure was dedicated for public worship in 1888. Before it was finished the congregation worshiped in the basement. The late King Kalakaua had much to do with the building of the church. He used to attend the church meetings in the basement, and on one occasion made a long and interesting address, in the course of which he said that as a human being had two eyes, two ears, two hands, and two limbs, so the new church must have two towers, and his suggestions were carried out.

At the church dedication services the late Dr. Hyde offered the opening prayer, Rev. H. H. Parker the dedication prayer, Hon. Henry Waterhouse delivered an address, and the late Dr. Lowell Smith an historical address. Thirteen native Hawaiian pastors assisted in the services, which were attended by an overflowing congregation. No one will regret more the loss of Kaumakapili Church than Mrs. B. F. Dillingham, who is away in the States.

The large pipe organ destroyed was the finest in the Islands. It was built by Messrs. Bevington & Sons, of London, from the design and specifications made by Wray Taylor, who superintended its erection in the church when it arrived, the early part of 1888. Before it was sent out it was played on in the factory by Dr. Bridge, organist of Westminster Abbey, who pronounced it an exceedingly fine instrument. The late Queen Kapiolani, who was in England at the time, heard Dr. Bridge play on it. It had two rows of keys, twenty-five draw stops, four couplers and two octaves of carillons on a separate manual worked by pneumatic action. Its cost was \$4,500.

On April 7, 1888, Wray Taylor publicly exhibited the instrument with a recital in the presence of a large and appreciative audience. Ever since then he has had the entire control of the organ; and, for four years, has acted as organist in conjunction with his other duties at St. Andrew's Cathedral. During these twelve years the organ has never cost the church anything for repairs, so careful was Mr. Taylor about keeping it in order. A large number of organ recitals and concerts have been given in Kaumakapili Church, and many singers have made their debuts at these entertainments.

The chime of bells, eight in number, were in the Waikiki tower, which first caught fire. They came from Troy, N. Y., and were obtained through the firm of E. O. Hall & Son. For some reason or another, the chime was never a complete success, not being quite in tune. For this reason Mr. Taylor could not on many occasions be persuaded to ring them. The pulpit was made of native kou and koa, being a very fine piece of work. The church was fitted with folding opera-house seats, and was probably the most comfortable edifice of its kind in Honolulu.

CENTRAL UNION CHURCH.

Organization of Relief Work and Committees Named.

At a meeting of the standing committee and trustees of Central Union Church held yesterday afternoon it was unanimously resolved to assist the public authorities to the utmost in the work of relieving the necessities of those made destitute by the fire and plague devastation, especially in providing clothing for the women and children.

The following ladies were appointed to represent the different districts of the city: Mrs. J. M. Whitney, Punahou; Mrs. Wm. A. Bowen, Makiki; Mrs. J. A. McCandless, Waikiki; Mrs. Theo. Richards, Punchbowl; Mrs. J. B. Atherton and Mrs. A. F. Cooke, Kawaiahae; Mrs. W. W. Hall, Nuuanu; Miss Pope and Miss Needham, Palama; central district, Mrs. C. M. Hyde, Mrs. H. A. Parmelee, Miss Yarrow and Mrs. H. C. Brown.

These ladies are requested to meet in the church parlor this morning at 9 o'clock, to lay out the work for the several districts. All ladies willing to assist in making garments are requested to report for work to the lady of the district nearest to them.

The meeting also voted a generous sum of money to provide material for clothing, and Messrs. P. C. Jones and W. F. Allen were appointed a committee to receive contributions of money.
