NEW ORGAN—The congregation of the new church near Dover, under the pastoral charge of Rev. Messrs. Zeigler and Deininger, recently purchased a new organ from the establishment of M. A. Blumlein, of this borough. The instrument was put up by the superintendent of the manufactory, Mr. H. F. Berger, who is the builder of the celebrated organ in St. Augustine's Church, Philadelphia, which is the largest in America.—The new organ is finished in beautiful style, and contains a double stop Disposition Bass. The consecration, of which due notice will be given, will take place in a short time.
