From the Minister of Music...

How does a church choose a new organ? Why the need for a new organ for this church now? Parts of our old organ were inaccessible for tuning and maintenance. Since major repairs were needed, the committee debated various alternatives. The final recommendation was to build a new instrument, but to incorporate several ranks of usable pipes from the old instrument.

The committee and the church wisely chose a first-class instrument by a world-class builder... Casavant Frères. "Birthing" this organ was neither easy or short-term labor! All the committee meetings, reams of reports, technical data and organ descriptions, on-site visits, pipe vs. electronic, and difficult sanctuary decisions required patience, perseverance, and not a little extra Christian charity from the committee. We owe a real debt of gratitude to this committee for their fine work.

And so, the new organ is here in all its aural and visual glory and beauty! And it has exceeded even my fondest hopes and dreams - for both the organ

and the sanctuary. This is a very special and distinctive instrument - not only for this community but for this whole area. I don't know of an organ in the entire Midwest that has a case-work more beautiful than this. And the sound is even more glorious and special than the committee heard in other Casavant organs we visited.

This organ will enrich the worship of this and many future generations of this church and also be a wonderful resource for area music lovers. We are not only blessed with a very generous congregation, but with an organ of great beauty and integrity which will lead us in reflection, prayer, and praise as we seek to glorify God. In the remaining years of my ministry of music, I feel most privileged to serve this congregation, its choirs, and God, through playing this organ.

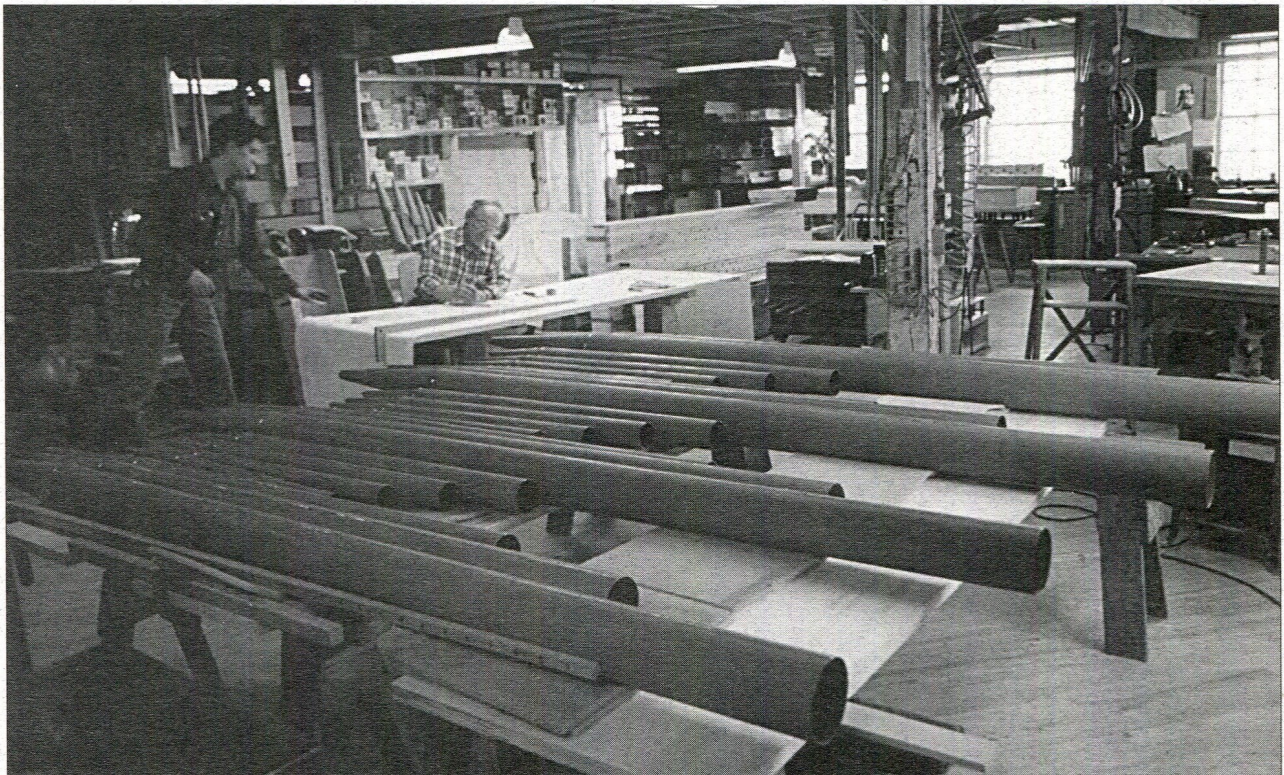
