

Handsome Church Organs.—The authorities of St. Matthew's German Lutheran Church, on Canal, near Baltimore street, (Rev. Chas. G. Weyl, pastor,) have just had manufactured for that church a fine toned organ, by Mr. Henry F. Berger. The case is of solid walnut, in the old Roman style of architecture, measuring 12 feet in helpht, 6 feet deep, and 74 feet wide, with eleven stops, pedal, and one row of keys. The stops are finely voiced, and the appearance of the instrument is an ornament to the church. It was performed on last Sunday morning for the first time by Mr. Berger, and in the afternoon by Mr. Einstan, organist of the Lutheran Chapel congregation, whose choir was also present.
