

THE PROCEEDS of the recital tonight will assist the Ottawa Centre in the International Congress of Organists. The Congress—held every ten years—is taking place in 1967 in Toronto, Ottawa and Montreal. Here in the capital we look forward to a recital on August 26th with Hugh J. McLean of Vancouver playing in Dominion—Chalmers United Church and to a Congress Church Service on August 27th in Knox Presbyterian Church.

The Organ

Dedicated less than a year ago, the new Casavant organ in First Baptist Church is voiced on classical lines and contains a total of 1,870 pipes deployed in 36 ranks which comprise the three divisions of this instrument: the Great, Swell and Pedal. The Swell occupies the usual "expression chamber" with movable shutters; the Great and Pedal organs are unenclosed and stand at the front of the gallery.

The specifications, which may be seen on the back page, were prepared by the tonal director of Casavant Frères in consultation with the organ committee of the church and Mr. Raymond L. Barnes. Mr. Barnes carried out the installation and the tonal finishing.
