

The Great and Choir organs are situated in a chamber on the right side of the chancel, the Swell and Solo to chancel left. The Pedal is divided. Wind pressures are moderate to high with the Great on 4 1/2", the Swell 5", the Choir 4", Solo 10", Antiphonal 4" and Pedal 4 1/2" and 6".

The façades contain pipes from the 16' Pedal Principal and the 8' Great Principal along with a number of non-speaking pipes.



The installation of the Austin 76 rank pipe organ portion of this instrument for LaGrave Avenue Christian Reformed Church called for the reconciliation of two needs, which would seem mutually exclusive. First, the need for an instrument that would lead congregational singing, accompany the choir, play the great organ literature and do it all well! Second, to make our work meld with existing ranks of pipes and digital voices. This was our challenge, and an experience, that we are certainly glad to have accepted. Tonally, the organ can be described as American Classic in concept.

This instrument has touched the heart and soul of churchgoer, recitalist and organbuilder alike.

We are honored to have been chosen to build the pipe organ portion of this world-class instrument, and are most gratified to know that it will meet the musical needs of LaGrave Avenue Christian Reformed Church for many, many years to come.
