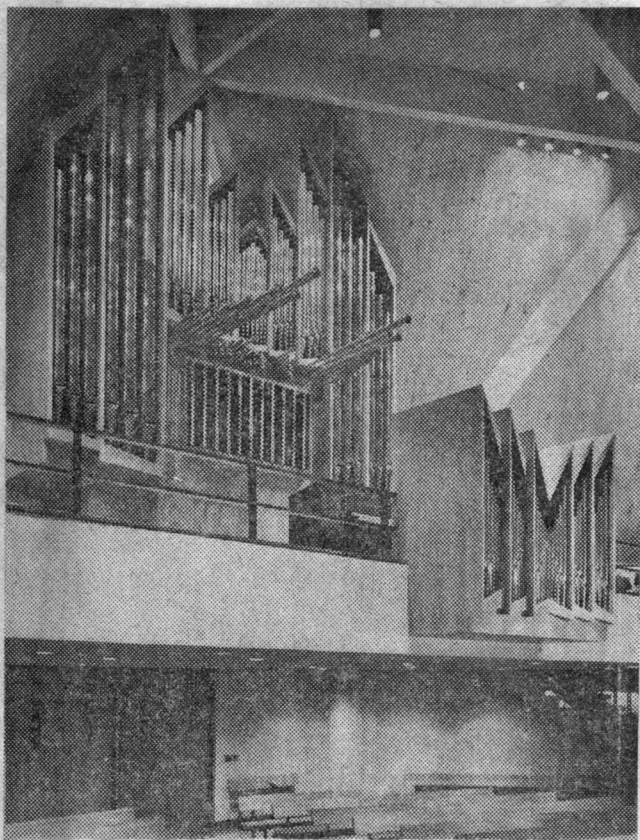

Zumbro Pipe Organ To Be Dedicated

## Organ Dedication Services Slated at Zumbro Lutheran

Zumbro Lutheran congregation will dedicate its new Aeolian-Skinner pipe organ throughout the day Sunday.

After dedication services at both 8:30 and 10 a.m., the opening concert on the 52-rank instrument is to be played at 8 p.m. by Dr.



Dr. Robert Anderson, chairman of the organ department at Southern Methodist University in Dallas and reputed to be one of America's greatest young organists.

Beginning in 1957, Anderson, 36, spent more than two years on a Fulbright grant, studying with Helmut Walcha, the great blind organist in Frankfurt, Germany.

He has appeared on a number of occasions in European music festivals, national and regional parish churches, colleges and universities all over the world.

Guest preacher for both morning festival dedication services will be the Rev. Dr. A. R. Kretzmann, pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of St. Luke in Chicago. He is regarded as an authority on liturgical art and aided Zumbro as it began to plan its present structure at 3rd Avenue and 6th Street SW.
