**A NEW and SPLENDID CHURCH ORGAN.**

A new and superior Organ has just been completed by Messrs. Hunter & Buffington, of this city, for the German Reformed Church, Race Street. It contains two sets of keys, for the Great and Swell Organs, with a separate Choir Bass, and Pedals. The compass of the Organ is from C C C to F in alto. The following is a description of the stops:
