Memorandum of Agreement,

town, Maryland, party of the first part, and

Witnesseth:- That the party of the first part hereby agrees to build an organ after and
according to the annexed specifications and plans to be hereafter approved by party of second
part, and to erect it in ... German American Ebenezer Baptist Church, ...
Detroit, Mich.

ready for use on or before the 23rd day of November A. D., 1921,
or as soon thereafter as possible in the event of delays beyond his control.

2. The party of the first part agrees that the organ when completed shall be first class, free from
defects in material or workmanship, and that the party of the second part may have it examined,
immediately on completion, in the presence of representative of first party, by a competent and
disinterested expert, and if said examination shows that the organ does not conform with this
agreement the party of the first part agrees to remedy defects at his own expense.

3. The party of the first part guarantees the action and construction of the organ for a term of
one year from date of completion and agrees to correct defects in material or workmanship that
may be brought to his attention within that time, without cost to the party of the second part.
This does not include tuning or ordinary care of the organ (or electric motors which are guaranteed
by the manufacturers for one year).

4. In consideration of the above, the party of the second part agrees to pay to M. P. Moller, Inc.,
or order, the sum of Five Thousand \$5,000.00 Dollars

AS FOLLOWS: Cash on completion

5. The party of the second part also agrees that the building will be in proper condition for the
installation of the organ ... three weeks previous to date of completion; that they will
allow, free from interruption, suitable convenience and opportunity for the installation in the build-
ing, provide such a condition of quiet as is necessary for the proper tone regulation and tuning of
the instrument, and necessary light, heat and power.

6. The party of the second part also agrees to insure the organ or its parts against loss by fire,
water, etc., as soon as the parts are placed in the building, for the benefit of the parties hereto, as
their interests may appear.

7. When electric motor is included in specifications, party of the second part agrees to provide foundation and enclosures when necessary; to furnish and install all wind conductor from blower and organ; to do all wiring connected therewith; to install such lights as may be needed for the erection and future care of the organ, and do any necessary cutting of floors, partitions, or other parts of the building. In the event that automatic remote control motor starter, electrical conduits or other special equipment are required they are to be furnished by party of second part.

8. When organ chambers are so located that organ must be hoisted by skids, block and tackle or other mechanical means the necessary apparatus is to be furnished by party of second part.

9. It is mutually agreed that the title and ownership of the organ shall remain with party of the first part until the contract price, before mentioned, has been fully paid, after which the instrument shall become the property of the party of the second part; also that all verbal agreements and understandings are merged in this contract, and the specifications and details of construction attached hereto.

Gentlemen

Re: Ebenezer Bapt. Church, Detroit, Mich.

We are returning herewith blue print which you submitted to us a short time ago.

We have made a few notation on this blue print to which we want to call your attention, and we kindly request that you furnish us with a re-vised blue print as soon as possible.

1. In view of the fact that we intend to cut out that part of the platform where the organ is to set, and have the organ set on the main floor line level, the lower part of organ casing shown on blue print (elevation A-A) will not be exposed, and consequently the panneling would have to be arranged to conform with the platform height, which is approximately 2'6" above the main floor level.

2. We find that we will not have 16'9" in height as you had designated on your blue print. After allowing 2'6" the height of our platform we find that we will have only 16'8" in the front part of organ chamber and only 15'11" in the rear. We have shown these dimensions on the enclose blue print.

3. When the rolling door, which separates our main auditorium from the Sunday School room, is opened a portion of the organ, approximately 4'0" is exposed and we think to make that part look right, and in order to have same conform with the front and side elevations, that part ought to be finished with panelling below and pipes above same as the other fronts.

Trusting this will give all the information you need in order to prepare re-vised blue print, I am,

Gentlemen

Your letter of recent date has come to hand.

We are ready to close the contract covering our organ and if you will send revised contract we will have same signed by our trustees and returned to you.

We have decided to use the Tubular Pneumatic action in our organ; also to have the Salicional Stop added, therefore, as your latest price was \$4850.00 and having deducted \$250.00 for useing Tubular Pneumatic Action and attached console, and adding \$400.00 for the Salicional Stop brings the price to \$5000.00.

Of course, there are some details to be arranged regarding the design of this organ, which the writer will take up with you at an early date, and which you will take care of as per your previous letter.

We cannot state positively, at this time, whether we will pay in cash the total amount of contract when the organ is installed, but we understand from your contract submitted recently that you will accept a note (or notes) for part of the amount.

Your letter of October 13, enclosing specifications for an organ for the Ebenezer German Baptist Church, this city, was received some time ago, but on account of the writer's absence from the city, this matter was delayed.

We have noticed that you specify the Action of this organ as follows: "Moller's Patent-Tubular-Pneumatic throughout" No doubt where organ and console are attached this action is very satisfactory, however, this will not be in our church, that is, the console will be detached from the organ.

The organ will have to be placed in a room, or chamber, directly above the platform, which is occupied by choir and minister. The console will, or should be placed on main floor of church auditorium, directly in front of platform. Therefore, it will be necessary to have electro-pneumatic action.

Please advise us by return mail what your price would be on an organ, such as you quoted us on under date of October 13, equipped with the electro-pneumatic action, and arranged with detached console as mentioned above.

In view of the fact that our committee wants to get together soon regarding this matter, we are sending this letter by "special delivery" and would kindly request that you let us hear from you at the earliest date possible.
