

RED BANK ITEMS.

During last week Messrs. J. H. and C. S. ODELL, of New York, erected in Christ church, Shrewsbury, a new organ. The instrument is placed in the gallery over the entrance to the church and occupies somewhat more space than did the old one. It has two manuals and fifteen stops, ten of which are speaking. In the great organ are the Melodia, Dulciana, Stop Dia Bass and open Diapason all 8 feet, with the Octave which is 4 feet, and the Ped. Bourdon which is 16 feet. In the swell organ are the flute unison bass, stop diapason and viola all 8 feet stops. The case of the organ is of chestnut and walnut oiled, with handsomely decorated pipes in blue and gold—and adds very much to the appearance of the interior of the church. In tone the instrument is excellent, while in its mechanism is included all of the latest improvements.
