

Edward Clark received his Bachelor's Degree from Tufts University and his Master of Sacred Music Degree from Union Theological Seminary's School of Sacred Music. He studied organ with Claire Coci and Mildred Andrews and harpsichord with Eugenia Earle and Davitt Moroney. Mr. Clark has been Minister of Music at the historic First Church of Christ, Congregational, Farmington since 1965. He is organist for the Hartford Symphony Orchestra. For over twenty years he was a member of the organ and harpsichord faculty at the Hartt School of Music, University of Hartford. He has made frequent appearances with the Arcadia Players Baroque Orchestra, the Springfield Symphony, Orchestra New England, the Hartford Chorale, the Hartford Chamber Orchestra, CONCORA, and Chorus Angelicus as well as with numerous church choirs. He has performed in recital and with chamber music groups throughout the Northeast. Mr. Clark has been active in the American Guild of Organists, serving as Dean of the Hartford chapter, education and exam coordinator, judge for local and regional young organist competitions, and currently as the newsletter editor/ publisher. Mr. Clark has made a number of trips studying historic organs of Mexico, Italy, Germany, the Netherlands, and Scandinavia.
