

### ABOUT THE ORGANIST

Thomas Trotter is Organist to the City of Birmingham, England. Appointed in 1983 as successor to Sir George Thalben-Ball, Mr. Trotter is the youngest organist to hold the post. He appears regularly with the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra and also performs thirty completely different solo recitals each year on the Town Hall weekly recital series.

Mr. Trotter served as Organ Scholar at King's College, Cambridge from 1976 to 1979. He received First Prize and Bach Prize at the 1979 St. Alban's International Organ Competition and was named Greater London Arts Association Young Musician in 1980. Among his teachers were Gillian Weir and Marie-Clair Alain. Mr. Trotter performs throughout the U. K., Europe, Australia, Japan, and the United States. He records for the Hyperion label.

### ABOUT THE ORGAN

The installation of the great Reuter Organ in the chancel and, at the same time, the reworking of the 1973 Casavant instrument in the gallery of our church, has brought to a happy conclusion the original plans for an instrument adequate to the tradition of great music in this magnificent building.

Both organs and the Imperial trumpet over the east door are playable from the new four manual console in the chancel. The gallery organ console controls only the Casavant pipes. State-of-the-art electronic wizardry, however, makes it possible for the two organs to operate independently with two organists.

The organ in the chancel is comprised of five divisions—the great organ, choir organ, swell organ, solo organ and pedal organ. There is a total of 120 ranks of pipes and two electronic pedal stops at 32 foot pitch in the combined chancel and gallery organs. The instrument is a masterpiece built by the Reuter Organ Company of Lawrence, Kansas, and is their major instrument in the eastern United States. This particular builder was chosen after exhaustive investigation of the leading organ builders in this country.

The presence of such an instrument, a gift of peerless generosity and foresight by the donor, will be an attraction not only to the community, but also to church musicians of the highest quality, thus ensuring the continuation of a tradition of great music for which this church has been well-known for generations.
