### THE SUILLIANTY FIPE Organ Möller

Our Möller Pipe Organ, dedicated in 1952 in memory of James Bryant and Louella Ezelle O'Quinn, actually contains several organs which are called divisions: Great, Swell, Choir, and Pedal. The Great and Choir Organs are housed in a chamber over the piano side of the choir loft, while the Swell and Pedal Organs are located above the organ console side. The original organ was designed by David Woodhall and installed by John Horton.

After it was determined by the 1988 Music Committee, Alan Thrower, chair, that the organ was tonally outdated and in a state of deterioration, efforts were made to plan a renovation project. The 1989 Music Committee, Bill Fallin, chair, selected to name the work in memory of Miss Laurie Shurley who served as Church Organist from 1922-1952. George Miller was secured to perform the renovation.

Our achievement in sound reflects a rich church music heritage and is an expression of praise to God.
