



Joyce Jones is Head of the Organ Department and Organist in Residence at Baylor University. She is a Fellow of the American Guild of Organists, and holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Texas, as well as a bachelor's and master's from the same institution. She also holds a Master of Sacred Music degree in composition from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. She has had nine books of organ music published. The magazine "Contemporary Keyboard" twice named her second most popular Classical Organist in their annual poll (first place was won by the late Virgil Fox). She has played concerts throughout the United States, Canada and Europe, including the Mormon Tabernacle, Notre Dame Cathedral, The Riverside Church, and the Crystal Cathedral.

ORGAN DEDICATION RECITAL



The new pipe organ for First Baptist Church/Orlando's new Worship Center was built by the Schantz Organ Company, a family business since 1873 and nationally known for the outstanding quality of its instruments. Our organ was the gift of an anonymous donor to whom we owe a great debt of gratitude.


Our Schantz organ was completely handcrafted in every detail at the company's plant in Orrville, Ohio. The parts of the organ were painstakingly assembled and tested as far as possible at the factory. Then it was disassembled, shipped to the church in four tractor-trailer truck loads, and reassembled in its entirety. Because of its physical size, it could not be tested as a complete instrument at the factory. Final testing of the largest rank, and testing and voicing of the complete instrument were done at the church. Building the organ employed scores of craftsmen, some of them fourth-generation Schantz family members.

The tonal design was planned by our Organ Committee in collaboration with our consultant, Dr. Donald P. Hustad, organist for the Billy Graham Crusades and Professor of Organ at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky, and officials of the Schantz Organ Company. It was designed to play all types of organ literature and accompany the congregation, choirs, and soloists. It is an instrument ideally suited to praising the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

The architectural design was coordinated with Hatfield Halcomb of Dallas, Texas, architects for the building. The Solo, Choir, and Ancillary Divisions are located on the left side. The Great and Swell Divisions are on the right. The Pedal Division pipes are distributed throughout the organ. Two solid-copper, horizontally-mounted trumpet ranks, one just below the Choir Division and one just below the Swell Division, project from the front of the organ. All of the exposed pipes are functional and are arranged visually to direct attention to the central stained-glass window.

All of the controls are located in a mobile, four-manual console normally positioned on a hydraulic lift with the nine-foot grand piano and the music director. This lift can be raised or lowered independently or coupled to the adjacent orchestra lift. The console can be rolled to the front of the pulpit platform for concerts and moved to the main floor if necessary for musical drama presentations.

It is anticipated that the inspiring music from this marvelous instrument will play a part in many thousands of decisions for Christ in the generations to come.
