

Organ Stops in Key Board.

The new Haskell organ which Edward Donnelly, of Philadelphia, is erecting in the Baptist Church for the C. S. Haskell Company, is the only one of its kind here that has the patent key draw stop action. The stops are not of the draw kind but are in a row above the manuals in the shape of a keyboard. It is a very convenient arrangement for the organist. The organ has two manuals, a pedal and swell speaking stops. There are six great pipes, four swell, two pedal and a grand crescendo pedal. There are four couplers. Eight pipes are eight feet high, two are sixteen and two are four feet. Five combinations can be made, three on the swell and two on the great organ. The organ is operated by water motor.
