
DONATES NEW ORGAN

By far the major gift of St. John's for the 75th Anniversary is the fine new Pipe Organ presented by Reinhold Zielesch. This organ was built and installed by Hillgreen, Lane and Company of Alliance, Ohio. It is a two manual and pedal instrument containing six ranks of pipes and a total of four hundred twenty-six pipes. It has Deagan A Chimes which are of highest grade. The organ is operated by electro-pneu-



matic action, and is voiced especially for liturgical church services.

The sale was negotiated by the company representative, Mr. A. Lindquist of Detroit who also installed the instrument.

The organ fills a read need. Its beautiful tone is immediately recognized by all who hear it. St. John's congregation is indeed fortunate to have such a fine instrument. To Reinhold Zielesch herewith is expressed the profound thanks of St. John's for his wonderful gift.

I hope to find information about the disposition of the 1947 pipe organ and perhaps some photographs and other information; I have not seen the instrument elsewhere in the church.

To the left are images from the 1947 75th Anniversary Book regarding the donation of the instrument and a Sunday evening recital.

The images below are of a previous organ probably from 1909. The image with the caption also from the 1947 Book; the description of the 1909 organ and the image with the keys is from the 1972 Centennial Year Pictorial Album.

By 1909 the congregation had grown to a point that it became necessary to enlarge the church and a wing was built on each side at a cost of \$2,800.00. A pipe organ was installed at a cost of \$1,200.00. The Dedication took place on August 7, 1909. After serving the congregation nearly 22 years Pastor Lemster tendered his resignation in January of 1914. He left on May 7, 1914.
