New Church Organs.—The Catholic Church at Lynchburg, Va., Rev. Mr. Mulwye, has just received from the factory of Henry F. Berger, of this city, an organ, the case of which is in the style of Grecian architecture, measuring 11 feet in height, 7 feet wide and 4½ feet deep. It contains a single row of keys, with pedal and all the new and brilliant stops, some of which are voiced with great accuracy and sweetness. The power is sufficient to accompany 16 to 20 voices. The Protestant Episcopal Church at Cockeysville, Baltimore county, has also erected in their neat little building a new and beautiful organ, containing one row of keys, with a composition pedal, and the case of Grecian architecture, measuring 9 feet in height, 5 in width and 4 in depth. The stops include a pleasing combination of wind instruments, capable of the sweetest harmonies, whilst the exterior adds to the view of the church.
