DONALD P. HUSTAD

The Pastor and Staff, on behalf of the congregation, extend a cordial welcome to our guest recitalist. Dr. Hustad's musical training includes degrees at Northwestern University in Illinois, as well as studies abroad in London and Paris, where he studied with the eminent composer-organist Jean Langlais. His vast experience in church music includes work as a recording artist, arranger, composer, and conductor. He is in great demand as a conductor of church music workshops, clinics, lectureships, and recitals. He was team organist for the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association and Director of the "Crusade Men," "Hour of Decision" 1961-67. He is a noted author and hymnal editor, having edited five hymnals. His latest book,

Jubilate! Church Music in the Evangelical Tradition, is a scholarly and practical volume of great interest to all serious church musicians. Dr. Hustad is currently V. V. Cooke Professor of Organ, The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. He and his wife, Ruth, have three daughters.



JACK HARWELL

Jack U. Harwell, editor of The Christian Index, was born in Mobile, Alabama, October 18, 1932. He is the son of a Baptist minister now retired, Dr. H. H. Harwell of Mobile. He was educated in public schools of Mobile and received a degree in journalism from Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama. He worked for newspapers in Mobile, Birmingham and Atlanta, and spent four years as a public relations specialist for the U.S. Army and Air Force. He became associate editor of The Christian Index in September 1957, holding that post for nine years. He became editor in November, 1966. Dr. Harwell is the author of two books and co-author of a third book. Mercer University conferred a Doctor of Divinity degree on Dr. Harwell in 1976.

Dr. Harwell was elected to the Board of Managers of the American Bible Society in 1976. He was also on the Board of Trustees of the Southern Baptist Brotherhood Commission, 1976-1982. Mrs. Harwell is the former Blanche Virginia Beard of Troy, Alabama. Dr. and Mrs. Harwell have twin sons, Ronald and Donald, born October 25, 1955.


