## The Organ

The organ at Holy Family Church is displaced between two areas in the church building — the gallery and the south — east transept. Designed to fill the needs of both congregation and choir accompaniment, the instrument speaks directly into the nave from the gallery and directly into the choir from the transept. All divisions of the organ are exposed with the exception of the gallery swell. Both the gallery and the transept organs are controlled by a three manual console near the choir transept. The organ is number 10247 of the M. P. Moller, Inc., of Hagerstown, Maryland. The specifications:
