DETAILS OF CONSTRUCTION.

GROUND FRAME OR SILL to be extra heavy, this with the upright framing to be rigidly constructed of well seasoned material, every portion firmly put together with mortise, dove-tail or screws, no nails being inserted anywhere.

SWELL BOX The pipes of the Swell Organ to be enclosed in a swell box, covered with a thickness of matched sheathing and deadening felt, thus making a firm tight box. The shades to be vertical, made of the best white pine strips properly glued, the edges rabbetted and well packed with felt to insure tight closing and prevent noise.

RESERVOIR To be made in the most thorough manner, solidly framed and fitted with panels which can be removed so that all parts of the interior can be easily accessible. Double leathered throughout.

WIND CHESTS to be made in the most thorough manner of the best quality of well seasoned material, carefully selected with valve and windways so apportioned as to give the full amount of wind to the pipes, fitted with Electro Pneumatic Valves, thus making the touch light and the action prompt and reliable.

MANUAL KEYS to be made of the best quality of Ivory and Ebony, with bevelled overhanging fronts, ~~xxxxxxx fitted with adjusting screws for~~
~~regulating the depression of the keys.~~

PEDAL KEY BOARD to be Concave and Radiating.

METAL PIPES The large metal pipes to be made of the best quality of zinc, all other metal pipes to be made of a composition of lead and tin of the proper percentage to suit their respective demands.

SCALES AND VOICING of all stops shall be of the highest order of excellence each stop to preserve its own characteristic quality of tone and be of proper volume to insure the best balance and most pleasing effect from the respective combinations.

FRONT PIPES The arrangement of the front pipes and the design of the case to be in harmony with the architecture of the building and subject to the approval of the committee.

DETAILS OF CONSTRUCTION (Continued)

FRONT PIPE DECORATION The front pipes to be decorated in colors, with gold bays and bands, or finished in gold bronze lacquered.

ACTION....The action to be Electro Pneumatic, the same to be substantial, prompt and quiet.

PROVISIONAL STOPS Provision shall be made in the Console, bellows and layout of the Organ, for the additional stops marked (x) in scheme, so that at their installation, there shall be no rebuilding or reconstruction necessary to install the same.

IN GENERAL The entire organ in material and mechanism shall be of the highest order of excellence and the finished instrument equal to any of its size in this country.

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MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made thisday of1911

between U. S. Haskell, Organ Builder of Philadelphia Pa. Party
of the First Part and the
.....
.....Party of the Second Part.

THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH that the Party of the First Part agrees to build
and set up in the St. Luke's Church, Philadelphia (Kensington)
East, Huntingdon and B Street, an Organ in accordance with the
annexed scheme and specifications, of the best material and in the
most thorough manner and to deliver and set up the same on or
before April 16th, 1911.

THE PARTY OF THE FIRST PART agrees to warrant the said Organ and to make
good any defects due to improper workmanship or defective material
for five years, without cost to the Party of the Second Part.

THE PARTY OF THE FIRST PART further agrees to supply an Electric Blower
to blow the said Organ and to make all connections from the Blower
to the Organ complete, but this does not include the wiring
necessary to bring the current to the electric motor, or from the
console to the motor.

THE PARTY OF THE SECOND PART in consideration of the above and foregoing
agrees to pay to the Party of the First Part, the sum of Three
Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty (\$3250.00) Dollars in cash when
the organ is completed in the Church, to the satisfaction of the
Party of the Second Part.

THE PARTY OF THE SECOND PART agrees to do all of the work necessary in pro-
curing a suitable place for the Organ and Blower and to assume all
risk of damage by fire and water to the Organ, after the parts of
the same are delivered in the Church, also to give undisturbed
possession of the Church to the Party of the First Part during
the erection of the said Organ.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED between the Party of the First Part and the Party of
the Second Part, that payments can be made on account of this
contract, before the final completion of the same, without annull-
ing the contract.
