PROGRAM

1—SONATA ROMANTICA $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{a—Largo—Allegro} \\ \text{b—Adagio} \\ \text{c—Finale—Allegro} \end{array} \right\}$ P. A. Yon

This Sonata does not belie its title, showing the composer in a happy mood through all three brilliant movements.

(a)—Largo, introducing theme in broad impressive fashion; Allegro, developing same exhaustively.

(b)—Adagio, contains some of the most beautiful passages Mr. Yon has written.

(c)—Finale—Allegro, in the style of a toccata is a stunning piece of writing attained by few and excelled by none.

2—FRERES JAQUES! DORMEZ-VOUS? - J. C. Ungerer

A lullaby very much used in France to sing children to sleep.

It implies a call to Brother James (Friar) who has fallen asleep and has neglected to ring the "Matins" bell.

J. C. Ungerer is the organist and choirmaster of the St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York since 1893. He was born in Savoy (France) and is a graduate of the Lemmens School, Malines, Belgium.

3—TOCCATA AND FUGUE IN D MINOR, - J. S. Bach

Considered the most brilliant of all organ works of the great master.

4—CHRISTUS RESURREXIT (Hymn of Glory), O. Ravanello

Oreste Ravanello, organist of St. Mark's in Venice, is one of the most celebrated composers of the present day.

This piece illustrates the angels announcing, with trumpets, the resurrection of Christ and the sunrise on Easter Sunday.

5—AVE MARIA (New), - - - - M. E. Bossi

Maestro Enrico Bossi, leader of modern Italian composers for the organ, is the present director of the famous Academy of St. Cecilia in Rome. He is the composer of works of importance in practically every field, including the symphonic and operatic.

The "Ave Maria" is a fine example of melodic invention, tuneful and mystic. It is one of three new pieces composed for the "Italian Modern Anthology" published in America.

6—MARCHE CHAMPETRE, - - - - A. J. Boex

A characteristic and humorous march, illustrating the rustic life of the peasants.

7—ECHO, - - - - P. A. Yon

An unusual piece of workmanship in the form of a double canon in unison, but so skillfully written that none of the usual pedantic atmosphere of the canon is apparent.

8—FIRST CONCERT STUDY, - - - - P. A. Yon

A record in velocity and endurance in pedal playing, having 1467 notes in succession for the pedals in about three minutes' time.
