Dear Riley:

Your will revall my calling your attention to the negotiations going on with this school and my phone conversation week before last.

For years I have been working on Hugh Hodgson, Director of Fine Arts on the old Burke organ in the university chapel. February a year ago the chapel had a fire which ruined the three manual console. Every since then I have met with Hugh on many occasions trying to get him to do something with the organ. It started out with a new console only then I started some pressure through mutial friends to get him to get a new organ. This is difficult to do sometimes where the state government is involved. For a while I had him interested in a new organ of modern design. He was restricted to \$30,000 and other friends of his both locally and otherwise advised him to rebuild the present organ. This influence together with his own conservatism and training in the old romantic school prevailed.

At any rate the results are that the Board of Regents have approved the rebuild scheme and appropriated the \$29.067.50 to rebuild this organ, which includes all new actions, chests, reservoirs, console and etc. According to your price lists these items figure approximately \$18,000

I will not attempt to give the order in detail as I will have to return there and do a good deal of drawing and checking the various items. There are also about seven sets of pipes.to be included.

The contract is to is igned Wednesday the 11th.

These folks have redrawn: the contract, and this is almost word for word with my draft, and submitted a Contract Bond. They did not persue the matter of you guaranteeing to collect through me except they included this item in their bond.

When I received this through the mails yesterday I called Mr. Ebersole of Cochran and Co. Hagerstown and asked his advise on procedure. He asked me to main these to him which I have done.

I have had the care of the university organ since 1932 also Hugh's church organ, St. Luke's Episcopal, Atlanta for about the same time. Hugh has been a good friend and a booster but he is a little stubborn where he is personally involved. His main instrument is the Piano and he has played with most of the major symphonies.

My reasoning is that since the new organ is out the factory might as well get a good order out of the deal.
