- [4'] Principal 4' (open metal from c to c4; no pipes in bass octave, C to B).

Stop Action: The stops are controlled by a pedal to be held down by the player's left foot.

Wind Chest: Slider windchest

Winding: A right-side pedal works the feeder bellows.

Casework: Case in the form of an Empire-style cabinet, with major visible components of solid mahogany; keywell veneered in rosewood.
