

WINOOSKI, Nov. 5.—The pipe organ of the Methodist Episcopal church has been completed. It was made by the Hall Organ Company of West Haven, Conn., and was installed by George H. Thompson of that place. The organ case is built of oak and the front pipes are in French Leaf Gold Bronze finish. The action is electro-pneumatic throughout. The description of the organ is as follows:

Two manuals and pedals. Compass of Manuals CC to C4, 61 notes. Compass of pedals CCC to G, 32 notes. Electric action.

Adjustable. Pistons move the registers.

Two Pistons operating on Great and Pedal Stops and Couplers. Three Pistons operating on Swell and Pedal Stops and Couplers.

Pedal Movements

Balanced Swell Pedal, Balanced Crescendo Pedal, Reversible Great to Pedal.

Accessories

Swell Tremolo, Wind Indicator, Organist's bench, Crescendo indicator.

Generator of ample capacity to furnish current for the action.
