Source B for Kilgen was a list of Kilgen installations arranged by states, probably compiled in the 1950s. Opus 5719 is listed there as a two-manual instrument with no size or date given. An index to the Kilgen ledgers indicates that the organ was built in 1936. Another correspondent (now deceased) gave the size as 11 ranks. That same opus number, however, is supplied for an instrument at Holy Trinity Episcopal (601 636-0542) in Vicksburg, Mississippi.
