#### Notes

The information found in this document comes from the original contract located in the archives of Casavant Frères in Saint-Hyacinthe, Québec.

Southminster United Church traces its origin to 1913 when the Methodists in Lethbridge, Alberta began to build an 1,100 seat church. This building was completed in 1914 and became home to Casavant Frères Opus 857 in 1920. From the time of its origin the congregation was named Wesley Methodist Church until 1925 when it was renamed Wesley United Church during the formation of the United Church of Canada. Ten years later, in the midst of the great depression, the congregations of Wesley and Knox United joined together to form Southminster United Church.

The contract for Opus 2563 was for a significant rebuilding of Casavant Opus 857 that included a new four manual console and new pipework as indicated in the specification. The organ was also cleaned and releathered.
